Agenda Item 4. President's report – Brian Toby

In addition to the items outlined in the attached slides from the meeting, key items mentioned were

- As of today, we have >570 participants in this meeting.
- Toby thanked the speakers for allowing recordings of almost all the talks, as this creates a family friendly atmosphere for the meeting.
- Toby is hoping to have a Fellows reception next year for the 2020 and 2021 Class of ACA Fellows.
- The ACA Council would like to see more virtual workshops held both during the meeting and at other times of the year.

Agenda Item 5. Treasurer's report – Ilia Guzei

Highlights from Guzei's presentation include

- The ACA Finance Committee is an ad-hoc committee established 2 years ago. It includes two At-Large members and the immediate Past President
- Many thanks to Bill Duax on behalf of the Finance Committee and Guzei for his advice and assistance.

- 2020 is a different year due to the virtual meeting. Registration fees are different; comments have ranged from these fees being too expensive to being too inexpensive.
- Many thanks go to all vendors that have supported this meeting
- Membership dues have remained fairly constant over the last few years.
- Membership has been decreasing while the meeting attendance has plateaued.
 570 attendees are roughly equivalent to last year's meeting in Covington KY.
- Last year the ACA did well financially and had a really good meeting in KY.
- We are supposed to have a small loss this year. The ACA received a Paycheck Protection Loan and should be in the black by about \$12,000 if the loan does not need to be paid back.
- For next year's meeting a hybrid option (part in-person, part online) will be examined.
- Our goal is to remain cash flow positive, please make every effort to get your colleagues to join.

Agenda Item 6. Vice President's report - David Rose

Agenda Item 9. New Business

- a) Society re-naming initiative.
 - We would keep American Crystallographic Association as the current legal name regardless of societal re-branding.
 - Zoom poll conducted during the meeting, "Should we schedule a Zoom open forum on naming?":

Yes: 69 (85.2%)No: 12 (14.8%)

- Zoom poll conducted during the meeting, "I favor the following with respect to our society's name":
 - Leave it as the American Crystallographic Association: 14 votes (14.6%)
 - Rename it completely to reflect atomic-scale structural science: 38 votes (39.6%)
 - Use a name that includes American Crystallographic Association, but add a structural science tag: 44 votes (45.8%)
- Zoom poll conducted during the meeting, "My preference for our Society's name would be":
 - o American Crystallographic Association (no change): 5 votes (7.8%)
 - o American Structural Scientists Association: 7 votes (10.9%)
 - The Society for Molecular Structure: 13 votes (20.3%)
 - North American Crystallographic Association: The Structural Research Society: 13 votes (20.3%)
 - o North American Structure Determination Association: 5 votes (7.8%)
 - American Crystallographic and Structural Biology Association: 13 votes (20.3%)
 - The Structural Science Society: 8 votes (12.5%)
- b) Formation of a New U.S. National Division (USND)
 - The US National Committee for Crystallography (USNC/Cr) is interested in creating a USND and developing by-laws; Cora Lind-Kovacs described the reasons behind this desire.
 - The National Academy of Sciences is the umbrella organization for the USNC/Cr, but the National Science Foundation has withdrawn their funding for the committee.
 - The ACA could become the umbrella organization for the USNC/Cr in the future.
 - o The President of the USNC/Cr would sit on the ACA Council.

- ACA History Portal continues to accumulate wonderful content




















 - Would add more value to ACA membership as well as help advance crystallography











- Exhibitor booth space and sponsorships at Annual Meeting were holding steady up to 2020




























- Two budgets will be developed for 2021: one with a live meeting and one with a virtual meeting









 - 3. Add a secondary name to ACA that combines the two (such as American Crystallographic Association: The Structural Research Society)


















The USNCCr indicated an interest in creating a USND and is developing bylaws; Cora Lind-Kovacs & Branton Campbell will speak to this.












